The warranty is subject to both the conditions detailed herein and those in our **CONDITIONS OF SALE** a copy of which will be supplied upon request.

Island Plastics (the Company) warrants that the owner detailed in this warranty will, subject to the Company's conditions, receive free repair and replacement of any part, except those detailed in sections 5 and 8 below, which as a result of defective workmanship or materials, require repair or replacement within 12 months of the date of first registration with Island Plastics. No third party or employee can be considered a legal representative of Island Plastics and has no right to assume on the Company's behalf an obligation of any kind, expressed or implied or to bind entirely.

Any statement made by employees of the company must have been confirmed in writing within 10 days, otherwise the Company cannot accept responsibility.

Any customer's letters or instructions should be addressed to the Company and the Company shall not be responsible for any loss, damage or misinterpretation arising from phone calls not confirmed in writing or with correspondence sent to its employees.

The warranty is subject to the following conditions.

- 1. The product has not been overloaded or used for racing or time trials or used for hire or reward or otherwise misused under conditions not normally considered suitable for products of this type.

The following definitions apply:-

The MAXIMUM AUTHORISED MASS is the maximum technically permissible laden mass as defined by the vehicle manufacturer.

The ACTUAL VEHICLE MASS is the kerb weight of the base vehicle, together with the motorhome conversion "in running order" and including bodywork, coolant, oils, fuel, spare wheel, all possible fitted extras for the motorhome as detailed in our price list, drinking water, gaz and 75kg for the driver (68kg for driver plus 7 kg hand baggage). (The ACTUAL VEHICLE MASS is quoted to include extras whether you have fitted them or not).

**VEHICLE OPERATING MASS** is the **ACTUAL VEHICLE MASS** plus an allowance of 75kg for each extra passenger for whom a berth is provided together with a further allowance of 75kg for general goods.


The SPARE MASS CAPACITY is the extra mass, which you may carry and is calculated by deducting the VEHICLE OPERATING MASS from the MAXIMUM AUTHORISED MASS.



# MAXIMUM PAYLOADS FOR MOTOR CARAVANS

Provision shall be made within the Maximum Authorised Laden Mass of a Motor Caravan to accommodate <u>ALL</u> of the following:-

## A. The mass of the vehicle in running order.

The mass of the vehicle with bodywork in running order including coolant, oils, fuels, spare wheel, and driver.

N.B. The precise definition of mass is laid down in the EEC Directive on Masses and Dimensions of category M1.

A notional mass of 75kg shall be used to simulate the driver.

#### B. Passengers and their luggage.

75kg for every passenger seat as defined by the Motor Caravan Manufacturer.

N.B. In accordance with EEC Directive and Masses and Dimensions of vehicles of Category M1 (68kg plus 7kg luggage).

# C. General Allowance. WWW.Smallmotorhome.co.uk A general allowance of 75kgs.

#### D. Options and Ancillary Equipment.

- 1. The masses of all items of equipment offered as options by the manufacturer as stated in the manufacturer's published documentation whether or not fitted at the time of delivery and selected by the dealer/customer from the range of options available.
- 2. The mass of any item for which the motor caravan has been specifically designed to accept whether or not fitted at time of delivery.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The allowances under "D" shall include such things as batteries, toilets, gas cylinders and contents, bicycles etc, that is to say that if a bicycle holder is either fitted or is offered as an option, the mass of a bicycle shall be allowed for.

If a supplementary battery is fitted its mass should be allowed for

The manufacturer may specify where any gas cylinders should be stored thus the mass of the recommended cylinder must be allowed for.

#### WEIGHT DISTRIBUTION

It is recommended that heavy items are stored so that their weight is distributed over both axles. You should avoid excessive weights behind the rear axle. This includes the galley.

If you have to site a heavy load in a particular position, you should equalise the situation by having a compensating load elsewhere, so that the weight distribution remains even and you remain below the limits quoted for each axle. The maximum load for each axle is quoted in the vehicle handbook.

#### SEATING

In the ACCOMODATION UNIT the two large inward facing seats provide ample seating for relaxing or dining and have large storage compartments underneath. Other lockers, contain where supplied, your chemical toilet, ducted warm air heating system and mains electricity supply unit, etc. The secondary battery is under the passenger's seat. (If fitted)

The ROMAHOME accommodation unit has been designed for comfortable and convenient use by two people. The side facing seats are not suitable for fitting seat belts or lap restraints for either adults or children, who would be facing the wrong way for the belts to be effective.

The Duo Plus comes complete with two forward facing seats that can be easily removed and replaced with additional storage lockers

You have the choice of using these two seats separately, as single BUNKS in their normal mode, or by removing the back cushions, and using as two wider bunks. The two support rails, (which are supplied), may be fitted into the notches to span the gap between the two side bunks, and by pulling the seat bases (not the backs) towards the middle with the seat backs fitted into the remaining gap along the outside edge and providing a LARGE DOUBLE BED. There is a bed extension stored in the

The DINING TABLE when not required may be stowed in the Luton area and, if you have the freestanding type it maybe used outside your ROMAHOME.

The LUTON (over cab area), may be used for large or bulky items but you should avoid excessive weight which could make your unit top heavy.

The GALLEY is partially separated from the accommodation area by two fold-down WORKTOPS giving extra working area to the galley. With the supporting brackets in position they should not be used for heavy items. They are intended to act as "splash guards" for times when both the galley and accommodation area are in use. In their upright position they are held by catches which you should ensure are securely locked in position when driving. They may be used as BACK SUPPORTS for "lounging". The cooker worktop must be down whilst the hob is in use.

Avoid putting HOT PANS on fibreglass surfaces.

The offside of the galley is fitted with a two burner HOB AND GRILL. The use of this is covered by the separate manufacturer's leaflet.

# **VENTILATION**

It is recommended that you ventilate your unit as much as you are able. On no account should any of the fitted vents be obstructed, particularly those involving installed equipment or the gas storage compartment. Your safety may well depend upon this. The roof vent provides useful ventilation. Ventilation may be further increased by slightly opening the side windows. Top hung WINDOWS have variable positions, one with the security locks in the first notch. Wider openings are affected by tightening the locking devices on the window stays at the desired position. (They should be loosened before re-adjusting and not forced). However, you must ALWAYS ensure that the side windows are firmly and fully closed and it is recommended that roof vents be closed when the vehicle is moving. Ventilation is particularly important whilst cooking or whilst the unit is in use. It is surprising how much moisture the human body gives out even at night.

Without ventilation in a confined space, condensation can become a real problem.

**VENTILATORS** must be kept clean and clear at all times. The flue vent and air circulation vents for your refrigerator should be cleaned at least once every 12 months.

There are low-level air vents beneath the refrigerator and in the bottom of the gas storage locker - make sure they are kept clear of obstruction. www.smallmotorhome.co.uk

To help avoid **FROZEN LOCKS** in the winter, you should insert a small amount of glycerine. We remind you to take, and keep separate, a note of all key numbers. In case of difficulty, Island Plastics do keep a record of key numbers.

Care should be taken when **DRIVING** your motorhome in high winds or on motorways. As a high-sided vehicle, the performance is different from a car. In **HIGH WINDS**, particularly driving from a protected area into a gust, (e.g. past an opening in a hedge), a strong side-wind can dangerously interrupt your passage and you should therefore moderate your speed accordingly. On motorways or other high-speed roads, the **PRESSURE WAVES** from fast moving lorries or coaches can give you a real buffeting. Keep clear where possible and adjust your speed accordingly.

Your **ROMAHOME** is fitted with rear **CORNER STABILIZERS**. It is recommended that these be lowered whilst the unit is in use. **Before you drive off - make sure you have raised them -** a safety idea is to leave the brace across the vehicle clutch/accelerator until you are ready to drive off. Do not lower them to the extent that the unit is raised off the ground.

Romahome Duo, the JACK AND JACK HANDLE are stowed behind the drivers seat .

The STABILISER BRACE AND BRACE EXTENSION for lowering the spare wheel are stowed in the offside Bunk.
